

Board Meeting

March 16, 2026

Mayor Eilts called the meeting to order. Trustees Wittrig, Maness, Thornton, Springer, and Mohr were present.

Trustee Thornton moved to approve the minutes of the March 2, 2026, meeting. Trustee Springer seconded the motion, and all Trustees unanimously approved the minutes.

Trustee Wittrig had nothing to report for Water and Sewer.

Trustee Springer moved to approve the bills totaling \$35,363.49 for March. The breakdown includes the General Fund at \$14,962.76; Street Lighting at \$1,239.84; Civil Defense at \$53.90; Water Fund at \$8528.95; Sewer Fund at \$5,894.01; and TIF Fund at \$4,684.03. Trustee Thornton seconded the motion, and with a "Roll Call" vote, the motion passed.

Nothing to report on Police and Health with the absence of Trustee Nafziger.

Trustee Thornton had nothing to report on Streets and Alleys.

Trustee Mohr presented a quote for signs for the pond to the Board. It was agreed to order the signs from S & S Signs and charge the expense to the monthly bills.

Trustee Maness had nothing to report on Parks.

It was suggested that the Park Committee meet at the tennis courts at Railroad Park to discuss whether they could be rehabilitated into pickleball courts. If the weather permits, they agreed to meet at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 6, 2026, before the Board Meeting.

The 2026 Recycling Grant was approved and signed for \$10,723.63 for the year 2026-27.

A TIF application was approved for John Williams for Climate Control storage at 125 NW Main. The Board agreed to \$3500.00 for four years.

Trustee Manee moved to adjourn the meeting, and Trustee Springer seconded the motion, and all Trustees voted "Aye."
